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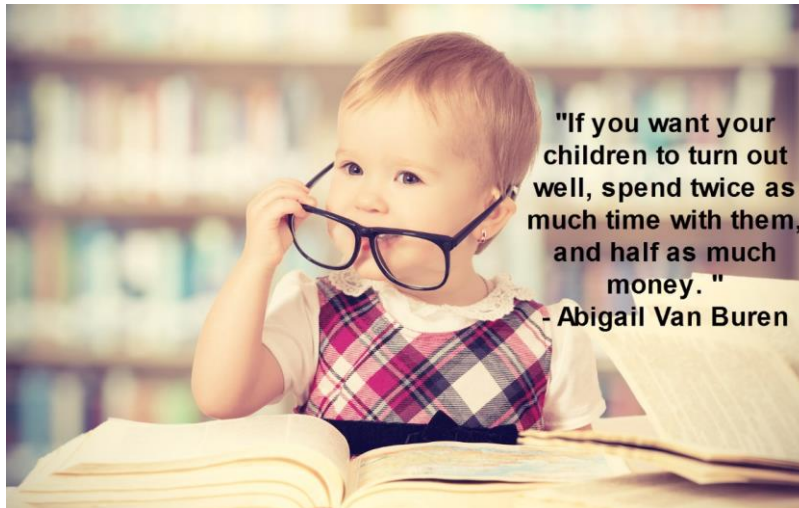
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BOOKS FOR EARLY READING: THE VALUE OF EARLY READING SKILLS

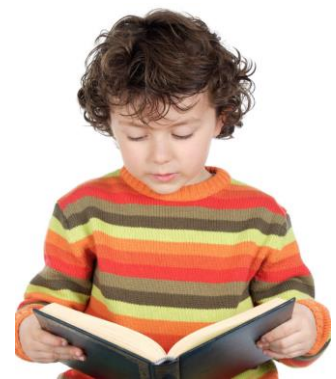
the rules yourself. But, you can also help to reinforce these values through the stories that your child reads.
